
# WHERE YOUR INCOME TAX U.S. FEDERAL BUDGET 2021 FISCAL YEAR MONEY REALLY GOES



### **HOW THESE FIGURES** WERE DETERMINED

urrent military" includes Dept. of Defense (\$728 billion) and the military portion (\$220 billion) from other departments as noted in current military box above. "Past military" represents veterans' benefits plus 80% of the interest on the debt.\* For further explanation, please go to warresisters.org.

These figures are from an analysis of detailed tables in the Analytical Perspectives book of the Budget of the United States Government, Fiscal Year 2021. The figures are Federal funds, which do not include Trust funds — such as Social Security — that are raised and spent separately from income taxes.

What you pay (or don't pay) by April 15, 2020, goes to the Federal funds portion of the budget. The government practice of combining Trust and Federal funds began during the Vietnam War, thus making

the human needs portion of the budget seem larger and the military portion smaller.


\*Analysts differ on how much of the debt stems

from the military; other groups estimate 50% to 60%. We use 80% because we believe if there had been no military spending, most of the national debt would have been eliminated.

## Government Deception

The pie chart (right) is the government view of the budget. This is a distortion of how our income tax dollars are spent because it includes Trust Funds (e.g., Social Security), and most of the past military spending is not distinguished from nonmilitary spending. For a more accurate representation of how your Federal income tax dollar is really spent, see the large graph.

75 Years of Nuclear Terror

n 1945 the United States launched the nuclear arms race by obliterating Hiroshima and Nagasaki, kill-Ling hundreds of thousands instantly, and, over time, thousands more from radiation poisoning. Despite cries of "Never Again!," today nine countries possess 14,000 nuclear weapons. A single bomb can destroy a city and kill millions. Two-thirds of the world's countries recognize the danger and want a nuclear weapons-free world.

The United States is a pariah: increasing its nuclear weapons funding under Presidents Obama and Trump; renewing the arms race with the creation of diabolical new warheads; refusing to participate in the 2017 UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

Even if a bomb were never detonated -
